3. Definition: Integrated Export Trading Company (IETC)

An **Integrated Export Trading Company (IETC)** is an operating entity or organizational structure that functions as a **neutral integration and execution layer** within international trade activities.

The IETC coordinates independent parties under a defined framework that emphasizes:

Typically a manufacturer, supplier, or producer located in the exporting country.

Responsibilities may include:

- Production and origin-side quality assurance
- Product conformity and export-side compliance
- Commercial readiness for international trade

Party B — IETC Operator

The integration and coordination entity implementing the IETC framework, operationally represented through **Wanty One LLC (United States)**.

Responsibilities may include:

- Supplier and origin coordination
- Export documentation alignment
- Compliance and execution oversight
- Quality inspection coordination
- Logistics orchestration and sequencing
- Risk and execution control across stages

Party C — Destination-Market Partner

A licensed distributor, contractor, or market operator in the importing country. Responsibilities may include:

- Import clearance and local compliance
- Regulatory alignment at destination
- Distribution, execution, or market delivery

5. Functional Characteristics

The IETC framework operates as:

- A structured execution and coordination model
